NOTES TO PART 1:

This articulation guideline is meant to assist transfer students in understanding how specific College of Alameda courses would be applied toward a CCA degree. Students are not required to complete all the courses prior to entering CCA.

A grade of C or better is required for Humanities and Sciences units to be eligible for transfer to CCA.

BA = Bachelor of Arts degree

BFA = Bachelor of Fine Arts degree

BARC = Bachelor of Architecture degree

Special Note Regarding Arch Math 1: MATHS-200: Arch Math 1: Advanced Algebra is considered a preparatory course for BARC majors to take MATHS-208: Precalculus, which is the Math requirement for BARC majors at CCA. Students who do not test into MATHS-208 will be required to transfer in MATH-203: Intermediate Algebra from one of the Peralta Colleges. MATH-203 will not count toward a BARC major's degree requirements; it is only preparing the student to pass MATHS-208 at CCA.
